GOVT 121 American Government (3 credit, 3 lecture, 0 lab)

IAI S5 900

Historical development and organization of national, state, and local governments; the Federal system, national and state constitutions.

GOVT 226 Introduction to International Relations (3 credit, 3 lecture, 0 lab)

IAI S5 904

Study of international relations with emphasis on contemporary international problems and relations. Includes analysis of international behavior, international law, foreign policy, causes of conflicts, and potential solutions.

GOVT 241 American Foreign Policy (3 credit, 3 lecture, 0 lab)

Acquaints the student with the basic concepts of American Foreign Policy. The importance of how history, men, women, location, and wealth of the United States influence the development of American foreign relations.

GOVT 260 Politics in States and Communities (3 credit, 3 lecture, 0 lab)

Historical development and organization of state government with an emphasis on the Illinois General Assembly and state constitutions. This course may be offered for variable credit and may be repeated three times.

GOVT 261 Federal and National Politics (3 credit, 3 lecture, 0 lab)

A hands on interdisciplinary study of politics at the national level. Study will be through lecture, discussions, guided study, and a trip to our Nation's Capital. Pre-Requisite: Instructor consent.

GOVT 280 Selected Topics in Political Science (3 credit, 3 lecture, 0 lab)

An in-depth study of selected problems or topics in political science. The exact content and instructional methodology will vary from semester to semester depending on the material to be studied. A syllabus or course outline containing additional information will be available with pre-registration materials each time the course is offered. This course may be repeated three times if different topics are considered, but cannot exceed a total of six (6) credits toward graduation. May be offered as variable credit.
