

## REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION FOR ENTRANCE INTO PROGRAM

REQUIREMENT	ACCEPTABLE PROOF
Health Assessment (Physical Exam)	Health Assessment completed by Health Care Provider. Must be turned in at orientation. <b>Do not have done until AFTER July 1st.</b>
Rubella**	IgG titer indicating immunity. You must provide the lab results showing an immunity for Rubella.
Mumps*	IgG titer indicating immunity <b>OR</b> documented dates of 2 MMR vaccinations.
Rubeola*	IgG titer indicating immunity <b>OR</b> documented dates of 2 MMR vaccinations.
Tetanus	Documentation of injection. ( <i>Expires after 10 years.</i> )
Pertussis*	IgG titer indicating immunity <b>OR</b> documentation of Tdap within last 10 years.
TB	Date of Two-Step PPD and results of both steps. ( <i>2 step Mantoux required or chest x-ray or Quantiferon-TB Gold</i> ) <b>Do not have done until AFTER July 1st.</b>
Varicella*	IgG titer indicating immunity <b>OR</b> documented dates of 1 Varicella vaccination.
Hepatitis B*	Hepatitis B titer indicating immunity <b>OR</b> documented dates of 3 Hepatitis B vaccinations <b>OR</b> formal refusal and Hepatitis B Vaccine Refusal and Acknowledgement of Risk and Release.
Health Insurance	The student must provide proof of current health insurance.

REQUIREMENT	ACCEPTABLE PROOF
Background Check	Background checks will be done through View Point. Once you have received instructions, please set up an account and get the background check ordered.
Healthcare Provider CPR Course	Copy of CPR course completion card listing expiration date. Certification must be <u>current through end of program date</u> . Course must be American Heart Association (BLS-Health Care Provider).

REQUIREMENT	ACCEPTABLE PROOF
Flu Shot	Documentation of yearly flu shot given between mid-September and the deadline set by the Director of Nursing.
10-Panel NON-DOT Urine/Drug Testing	The student will be notified when and where the drug screen must be completed. The student must test negative for the following drugs: <b>Marijuana, Cocaine, Phencyclidine (PCP), Amphetamines, Opiates, Benzodiazepines, Barbituates, Methadone, Methaqualone, and Propoxyphene.</b> Other drug screens may be required as directed by clinical rotations with the student being responsible for the cost of the drug screen.

\*History of disease is not proof of immunity

\*\*An antibody titer is a laboratory test that measures the level of antibodies in a blood sample. This determines if you need a booster immunization. Immunoglobulin G (IgG) is an antibody isotype.

**Students are responsible for any cost associated with the requirements described above.**

**Those accepted into the program, who have not submitted all of the above requirements by the deadline announced at the mandatory orientation. Will not be allowed to begin either program.**
